### WHAT IS A RESTORATIVE TEACHER EDUCATION?

A Restorative Teacher Education is a method to prepare teachers to create and sustain opportunities for intellectual engagement for all children while fostering an inclusive classroom ethos. In a Restorative Teacher Education, teacher educators create opportunities for aspiring teachers to develop a sociocritical literacy or a "historicizing literacy" (Gutierrez, 2009) in which they confront race, class, privilege, and oppression in their personal narratives and begin the ongoing work of understanding how these narratives impact their teaching philosophies, practices and—most importantly—their relationships with students.

# A "TRANSFORMATIVE" CONCEPTION OF RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

Using a transformative conception, restorative justice is "conceived as a way of life we should lead...among the key elements of this way of life is a rejection of the assumption that we exist in some sort of hierarchical order with other people...it rejects the very idea that we are ontologically separate from other people or even from our physical environment...this has implications in the way we use language, the way we treat other people and the environment, and the way in which we allocate resources..." (Johnstone & VanNess, 2013, p. 19-20)
